
Student Achievement: Retention Rate of First-time, Full-time Students Criteria, Thresholds of Acceptability, Goals Retention Advisory Board December 10, 2024

Demonstrating Student Achievement

The Retention Advisory Board identifies *retention of first-time, full-time students* as a criterion of student achievement for the University of Mississippi and discusses and approves the threshold of acceptability and retention goals annually.

Threshold of Acceptability

The Retention Advisory Board set the threshold of acceptability (minimum expectation) for retention of first-time, fulltime students at 80%. This threshold is based on a review of the UM overall retention rates (see Figure 1) and the focused and increased institutional commitment to improve retention rates that began in 2007.




Figure 2. UM Overall Retention Rate Trends compared to IHL and Peer Institutions.

The goal for retention of first-time, full-time students is to exceed the average of Mississippi universities that comprise the Institutions of Higher Learning (IHL) and to exceed the average of peer institutions (see Table 1 and Figure 2). 


Figure 2. UM Overall Retention Rate Trends compared to SEC and SUG Institutions.

Summary

The University of Mississippi has met the threshold for the retention of first-time, full-time students every year since the institutional commitment to improve retention rates began in 2007. Similarly, UM leads the state in retention rates as evidenced by the IHL peer comparison and has exceeded the retention rates of its peer institutions since 2020. With a commitment to reaching its aspirational goals, in fall 2022 UM tied the retention rate of the Southern University Group (SUG) and was within .1% of the Southeastern Conference (SEC) public institution retention rate.
